**For Violin, Viola, Cello and Bass:** ASTA repertoire is now acceptable during the year ASTA takes place (the next time ASTA repertoire is acceptable is the 2011 Music Olympics Competition) and with the following requirements: Selection must be from the Junior Division and from the specified list (“Any piece of competitor’s choice” is not an acceptable option for the Music Olympics Scholarship Competition).
